Brian Austin
Football / Track

Class of 2009



Brian was an outstanding two-sport performer in football and track and field. Brian's teams were highly successful during his high school career highlighted by an undefeated football season winning nine straight games before falling in overtime at the WPIAL Finals. In 2009, the Boys' Track team won

the WPIAL Championship. Brian was a three-time All-Conference football player as a two-way starter splitting time between wide receiver and defensive back, in addition to serving as a kick returner. He established single season records in his senior season for both receptions (64) and receiving yards (929). Furthermore, Brian set single game records in receptions (18) and yards gained (247). He was a team captain. In track and field, Brian earned four letters specializing in sprint and long jumping events. He won WPIAL championships in the 100-meter dash during his junior and senior seasons, while finishing in 3rd place at the PIAA Track and Field Championships. Brian established the school record in the 100-meter dash at 10.78 seconds. He was named first team All-State in Outdoor Track and Field.

Brian continued his athletic career with the Army Black Knights, where he lettered three years as a slotback and special teams' player. In 2010-11, Army became bowl eligible for the first time since 1996 and defeated Southern Methodist University in the Armed Forces Bowl. Brian also lettered in Track during his freshman season.

Brian Austin served in the U.S Army from 2013-2022 achieving a rank of Captain. Between 2013 and 2016, Brian served in multiple positions as an Infantry Officer as part of 7th Infantry Division, 2nd Brigade Combat Team at Fort Lewis, WA. Following these assignments, he graduated from the Special Forces Qualification Course achieving the honors of Distinguished Honor Graduate and bestowing the Green Beret. Brian was then assigned to 5th Special Forces Group, Fort Campbell, KY as a Special Forces Team Leader. During his time as a Team Leader, he was deployed to Syria in a defeat ISIS mission set in support of Operation Inherent Resolve. Upon completion as a Special Forces Team Leader, he was assigned to Human Resources Command, Fort Knox, KY as the Talent Manager for U.S Army Special Forces.

Currently, Brian is a graduate student at Duke University, pursuing an MBA with an expected graduation of 2024. Brian and wife Alexandra resides in Durham, North Carolina with their two sons, Hudson (3 years old) and Wyatt (6 months).

Karin attended Purdue University and played intramural tennis where she won the mixed doubles championship twice. Karin played softball from 1978-1980 and golf in 1980. She is a previous



member of the Women's Western Golf Association and competed on Shannopin Country Club's Women's Golf team. Karin coached boys' basketball for the fourth to sixth grades at Sewickley Academy. She is employed as the Austin's Playrooms Director, part of the Mario Lemieux Foundation.

Karin resides in North Hills with her husband Gerry, and has four children, ten grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Danielle Wall Volleyball / Basketball

Class of 2014

Danielle was an outstanding volleyball and basketball player for the Tigers. Danielle earned First Team All-State Volleyball honors and led the Tigers to the WPIAL Volleyball Championship in 2014. Danielle Wall was a "great team leader and an outstanding right-side attacker with great blocking technique", said head coach Heidi Miller. She played club



volleyball for four years at the University of Pittsburgh. Danielle is currently coaching club volleyball for ages fourteen and fifteen. She is employed by Allegheny General Hospital as an ICU Nurse. Last year, Danielle returned to the University of Pittsburgh to pursue a Doctorate in Nursing Practice in Anesthesia.

Danielle lives in the North Hills with her parents and is the proud Aunt of two beautiful girls Giorgia and Maria.

Rowing / Gymnastics

Class of 2006



Brittney was a two-sport athlete participating in Rowing and Gymnastics. She is one of the most accomplished rowers in North Allegheny history. Brittney was a member of the U.S. Junior National Rowing Team,

participated in the Junior World Championships in Amsterdam, Netherlands, as a member of the Women's Quad. She placed 17th at the World Indoor Rowing Championships. Brittney's abilities and leadership qualities led our team to such highlights as taking first place at the Midwest Championships in the Women's Double and Quad competitions, second place in the Women's Senior Quad at the Strokesburg Cup and third place in the Women's Quad division at the Youth National Championships.

Brittney continued her academic and athletic career at the University of Notre Dame. While at South Bend, she earned All Big East First Team All-Conference honors, was named to the All Big East All-Academic Team and was the Irish Team Captain. She earned four athletic monograms. The Irish Rowing team was named Big East Champions from 2006-2010. In 2007, Notre Dame was selected to participate in the National Championships, finishing in 12th place.

Brittney is a Physician Assistant in Bariatric Surgery for St. Josephs Hospital in Denver, Colorado. Brittney's family includes parents, Rita and Chuck Kelly, sister Jessica and husband Zach Brown.

Greg Manesiotis Jr *Baseball*

Class of 1990

Greg was a standout baseball player for the North Allegheny Tigers. Greg was one of the WPIAL's outstanding hitters and holders the records for batting average (.565) and an amazing on base percentage of (.778). Greg was named First-Team All-Section in 1989 and 1990. In addition, to being



an offensive threat, Greg displayed outstanding defensive skills. North Allegheny's baseball team was known to have set the standard for outstanding play. In Greg's senior season (1990), North Allegheny won its first WPIAL Championship. Greg continued his education and athletic career at Cuyahoga Community College.

Today, Greg is the owner of a third-generation family construction company known as Gregman, Inc. which has been in existence for over 100 years. Greg and company are known to donate thousands of dollars to athletic projects around the district. Greg and Wife Joy served as the Baseball Boosters Presidents for several years.

Greg and Joy have two children, son, Joe (NA Grad, Class of 2021), is a student and baseball player Southern Union State (Alabama) and daughter, Megan a junior, is a three-sport varsity letterman (golf, softball, and track/field) at the Senior High School.

Greg is proud to say that Father, Greg, Sr, son Joe, brother-in-law Jason Sekerak, father-in-law Butch Sekerak and himself all have WPIAL gold medals for championships teams as players and coaches. Greg, Sr. was inducted into the North Allegheny Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Nikki Luisi

Soccer / Track

Class of 2005

Nikki was a standout athlete for the Tigers soccer and track programs. She lettered in all four years for both programs. In soccer, Nikki played central mid-field. She impacted every game and was our anchor of success. She was a team captain, playmaker and had the responsibility to run the team's offense. Coach Chet Gapczynski refers to Nikki as the ultimate team player. Nikki's unselfish and talented play made her teammates better. In addition, Nikki was selected All State as a member of the Olympic Development Program. Nikki served in Student Council and was a committee member that sponsored the Pennsylvania Student Council Conference.



Unfortunately, with four knee surgeries in high school, Nikki could not play soccer in college, but excelled in academics and leadership. She earned the Helen Margaret Harrison Award for ZTA Sorority, which is the highest collegiate award recognizing high level of excellence in every phase of chapter operations. In addition, Nikki earned the Emerging Leader Award, was the Panhellenic Council President and an academic scholar. While at the University of Dayton, Nikki was awarded the Honor Ring symbolic for her years of service as an alumna of Zeta Tau Alpha Sorority. The Honor Ring is the highest individual honor given to an alumna. Nikki is certified in Human Centered Designed Situational Leadership. She is a consultant for TiER 1 Performance Solutions.

Nikki's family includes parents Sheila and Jim Luisi, and sister Danielle Luisi-Buettner. She resides in Springboro, Ohio with her husband Bernard Dalichau, and daughter Sloane, who already owns her first soccer ball.

year later, she broke the record with a vault of 12 feet 6 inches. Brooke was a three-year state qualifier for indoor and outdoor track.

At Westminster College, Brooke was a national qualifier in indoor and outdoor track, the Presidents Athletic Conference Pole Vault Champion in outdoor track, as well as a NCAA All-American for indoor track and a three-year Academic All-American.

Brooke is a science teacher at Lexington High School in Massachusetts. Brooke's family includes parents Margi and Louis, with sister Andi and brother-in-law Sam, brother Seth and sister in-law Paige, and her boyfriend Derrick.

Ken RockFootball / Baseball

Class of 1984

Ken Rock was a standout two-sport athlete for the Tigers football and baseball programs. Ken was named the football team's Most Valuable Player during his senior year. In addition, Ken was named to the Post Gazette's Fabulous 22 team during his junior and senior years. Kenny's talents helped the Football team reach the WPIAL Finals in his senior year.



Ken earned first team All-American honors in 1985 while playing for Phoenix Junior College before moving to Arizona State University in 1987. Later in his college career he would return to Western Pennsylvania and help Indiana University of Pennsylvania to reach the National Championship in 1990. Ken signed a professional contract in 1991 to play for the Pittsburgh Steelers. Ken is known to be one of the finest athletes in North Allegheny history.

Ken's parents are Edward and Sandra Rock, and siblings Keith and Kevin. Ken resides with his MVP, his wife Brittany.

Emily Humiston *Field Hockey*

Class of 2013

Emily finished her scholastic field hockey career the Tigers All-Time leading scorer in goals (61) and points (147). Emily is one of the greatest field hockey players to walk our halls earning WPIAL 3A All-State Honors from 2010-2012. Other awards included being named Rookie of the Year (2009), Offensive Player of the Year (2010), and Most Valuable Player (2011, 2012). Emily received All-State



Honorable Mention in 2010. She was selected to participate in the North Allegheny Sportsmanship Conference in 2012 and the Pittsburgh Regional Student-Athlete Leadership Academy. Emily played in the National Futures Championship from 2009-2013, and Junior Olympics (2010, 2011). She continued her career at Division I Providence College from 2013-2017 earning All Big East Academic honors three times and was the first female athlete to be name Student Athlete of the Month.

Emily is a Content Specialist II for Thermo Fisher Scientific. Today, she is the Head Varsity Field Hockey Coach at Fox Chapel. Her family includes her parents, Karen and David Humiston and brother Aaron.

North Allegheny has a reputation of winning football with an aggressive and physical style of play. There is no coincidence that the program's offensive line coach since 1987 has been Mike Buchert. He believes the game should be played at a high level with fundamentally sound technique. Except for a brief stint as Seneca Valley's Head



Football Coach, Mike has prepared many of our young men for offensive line play at the high school, collegiate and professional levels. For thirty-two years he was a valuable varsity assistant football coach, an innovative offensive coordinator with the ability and creativity to run multiple offenses including the Wing T to multiple formation sets. During Mike's tenure at North Allegheny, the football program had thirty playoff appearances, winning numerous section titles,17 WPIAL semi-finalist appearances, 6 WPIAL Final appearances: winning in 1990, 2010, 2011 and 2012, and three PIAA State Championships in 1990, 2010, and 2012.

Mike's winning ways began everyday as a Senior High Mathematics Teacher and extended to the football field. Mike expected greatness in the classroom as well as on the field. Last June, Mike retired from teaching and coaching. Mike is most proud of the outstanding relationships he has developed over the years with many of his players. Mike and his offensive lineman raised money for the UBO Toys for Tigers program and shopped for the toys to bring smiles to the children during the holiday season. Mike developed an annual alumni event each December whereby former players would get together to stay connected with "family".

Mike will always be known for being a tough and fair coach with elevated expectations, but for those that played for him, Coach Buchert, is a caring and warm individual that prepared his players for all competitions, but most importantly, prepared them to become lifelong learners in an ever-changing world.

Mike and wife, Judy have two sons, Michael, and Jason.

North Allegheny Girls Cross Country

It was another dominating 2021 for Coach John Neff's girls cross-country team as they went 8-0 in dual meets along with winning all three invitationals they participated in along with another WPIAL title and their seventh state title. The NA girls team made history by being the first AAA team in PIAA history to win four state golds in a row. In Hershey, the girls' finished an astonishing 87 points in front of second place Dallastown. Eva Kynaston paced the Tigers in the state title meet finishing in fifth place. Wren Kucler was right behind Kynaston in sixth place.



North Allegheny Boys Cross Country

The NA boys' cross country team continued their dominant run as well, winning their second state championship in a row and third in four year. In the state championship meet in Hershey, North Allegheny was in second place by 11 points with 1.1 miles to go, from there the Tigers would storm into the team lead and ultimately beat second place La Salle College by 62 points. Senior Scott Nalepa saved his best race for last, leading the Tigers and finishing the meeting in eighth place. Jack Bertram finished in 13th.

North Allegheny Girls Volleyball

In 2021, Coach Russ Hoburg's team saw a 57-match section winning streak end but was able to bounce back and finish the season with a 20-1 record, win their fourth WPIAL title in five years, and their fifth straight state championship. In the state final, North Allegheny beat Parkland by set scores of 23-25, 27-25, 25-18 and 25-15 at Cumberland Valley High School. Carissa Treser led the Tigers with 14 kills in the match. Jadyn Perkins finished with 12 blocks, Mia Tuman had 39 assists and Caroline Curran was huge on defense with 25 digs.



North Allegheny Boys Volleyball

Coach Dan Schall's boys' volleyball team saw their astonishing 75-match winning streak come to an end at the hands of Seneca Valley in 2021, but that did not change how the season ended as they finished the regular season 18-1, got revenge on Seneca Valley in the WPIAL Championship in a 5-set thriller and went on to win their fourth straight state championship defeating Parkland 23-25, 25-16, 25-12 and 25-23 at Penn State University's Rec Hall. It was North Allegheny boys' volleyball's ninth overall PIAA title. Over the past four seasons, North Allegheny has posted a record of 83-1. Including the North Allegheny girls' volleyball program, the two teams have a combined record of 191-3 over the past five seasons with a combined nine PIAA titles in that span. The only PIAA championship not won by an NA over the last five years was in the spring of 2020 as no season took place due to the COVID-19 pandemic.




