

PLANTING UNDER REDWOODS

The foggy Pacific Coast is home to California's state tree, the Coast Redwood (Sequoia sempervirens). For the landscaper, gardening under these majestic giants presents some significant challenges. Whatever you choose to plant beneath a redwood will face tough competition for water, light, and root space. Additionally, acidic soil is created by the decomposition of year-round redwood leaf

litter. The best bet for success is to select plants that naturally occur in the redwood forest. Devil Mountain has assembled the following list of understory plants that can succeed in a redwoodbased garden design.



GROUNDCOVERS

Groundcover plants stay below 12 inches tall and have a spreading habit that covers a wide area.

PERENNIALS

Perennials are soft-stemmed plants that do not form woody branches. This category includes many flowering plants, grasses, ferns, and succulents.
