UK and EU orders will be sent as soon as I can. Orders to outside the EU will all be sent together end of July/ August, as they will all need to be inspected together by FERA before dispatch. Snowdrops, and Fritillaria davidii will be damp-packed for posting. All plants are flowering size, unless otherwise specified.

POSTAGE AND PACKING - £5-50 per order. I am asking for less than the actual cost of delivery and packaging. If your order can be sent as Large Letter, I will refund any extra postage. Parcels will be sent by first class post, recorded delivery, so will need to be signed for. Orders can be collected from my home address if you are in the area.

The rim of the widely flared flowers is gently rolled back. Stamens and style exerted.</p>







<p>Narcissus AW 1580-2 £4 3 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>Narcissus pallidiflorus x watieri</i>) 2 W-W A lovely daff bred here. Growing to 15cm high, With a white perianth and pale yellow cup fading to creamy white.</p>	
<p>Narcissus AW 2374-A £6 8 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>obesus x trianderus</i>) 12 Y-Y Chubby sister seedling of Fat Rasca. 1-2 large lemon flowers on very short stems.</p>	
<p>Narcissus AW 2660-2-14 £7 5 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>watieri x asturiensis</i>) Delightful little 2 Y-Y with pale lemon flowers. 10cm high.</p>

<p>Narcissus Aureolin £15 3 available</p>	<p>BD (<i>jonquilla x scaberulus x Camborne</i>) 7 Y-Y Small multi-headed daff with deepest golden flowers of excellent show form. One of Brian's favourites.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Bundle £5 8 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>calpicola x watieri</i>) 7 Y-Y Charming multi headed flowers with 1-4 flowers per stem. Free flowering, growing to 18cm high.</p>






<p>Narcissus Cheep *</p> <p>£25 3 available Daffodil Society Approved Miniature Max one per customer.</p>	<p>BD (cyclamineus x Candlepower) 6 W-Y fades to W-W Superb white cyclamineus hybrid. Excellent show flower, has won many prizes. Best Miniature at RHS Rosemoor 2014.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Chirp</p> <p>£10 4 available</p>	<p>BD 1 Y-Y (<i>asturiensis</i> x <i>Candlepower</i>) Perfect little miniature trumpet, golden yellow throughout. Good show form.</p>

<p>Narcissus cordubensis</p> <p>£4 for 3 6 packs available</p>	<p>Fragrant species to 25cm tall with several golden flowers per stem. Corona is distinctly crenate.</p>	
<p>Narcissus cordubensis pale form</p> <p>£3 5 available</p>	<p>Rare sulphur yellow form of this very fragrant species. Corona is distinctly crenate.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Craigton Clumper</p> <p>£2.50 11 available</p>	<p>Early and very vigorous selection from <i>N. romieuxii</i> by Ian Young. Wide hoop petticoats of creamy lemon. Increases very quickly.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Cream Satin</p> <p>£8 2 available</p>	<p>AW (AW 2827-2) (<i>rupicola</i> x <i>Candlepower</i>) 2 Y-Y Pretty little daff with a delicate violet-like scent and satin-textured flowers of creamy lemon. Grows to 18cm high.</p>

<p>Narcissus cuatrecasii</p> <p>£4.00 14 available</p>	<p>Small species to 15cm high with 1-3 golden flowers per stem. Similar to <i>N. rupicola</i>, but the anthers are visible in the mouth of the tube. Scented.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Dawn Duel</p> <p>£8 7 available</p>	<p>BD 12 Y-Y (<i>cyclamineus</i> x <i>jonquilla</i>) Dainty flowers of golden yellow with a slightly deeper cup. Very free flowering.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Don Stead</p> <p>£5 2 available</p>	<p>Another Ian Young introduction, dwarf hoop petticoat with large pale yellow bells on 7cm stalks.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Fairy Gold</p> <p>£10 1 available</p>	<p>6 Y-Y Rare old Irish miniature growing to 15 cm with large bright yellow flowers with a swept back perianth.</p>

The similar seedlings are all about 20cm high, with a conspicuous upright green spathe which remains green as the flower matures.</p>	











<p>Narcissus Gale Force</p> <p>£8 5 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>rupicola x cyclamineus</i>) 6Y-Y One of Anne's favourites, 12cm high with deep gold flowers with a swept back perianth which makes the flower look like it is in the face of a strong wind!</p>	
<p>Narcissus Gipsy Vale</p> <p>£15 11 available</p>	<p>BD (<i>Gipsy Queen x obvallaris</i>) Beautiful little 1W-W miniature. Creamy white trumpets. Consistent show winner and has won many top prizes, including the Alec Gray trophy.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Giselle' AM*</p> <p>£20 6 available Max one per customer.</p>	<p>AW 10 W-W A much coveted self-sown hybrid presumeably between cantabricus and triandrus. Flower about 2cm wide, with a corona about 8mm long, golden yellow throughout and growing to about 12cm high, shorter outside. Does well in a trough here, even down to -17°C.</p>	
<p>Narcissus jonquilla henriquesii</p> <p>£4 for 3 5 packs available</p>	<p>I've done my best to key this out to the subspecies, but anyway it is a very fragrant golden jonquil growing to about 25-30cm in flower with several golden flowers to a stem. Vigorous and increases quickly.</p>

<p>Narcissus KB/M/1/98</p> <p>£3 6 available</p>	<p>A miniature bicoloured hybrid from Keira nursery in Australia. Useful for breeding miniatures, fertile both ways. 12cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Little Frills</p> <p>£10 3 available</p>	<p>BD (<i>asturiensis x Camborne</i>) 1 W-W White miniature trumpet daff with a frilled corona. Grows to 14cm high under glass.</p>













<p>Narcissus Ludo</p> <p>£15 6 available</p>	<p>BD (<i>asturiensis x Candlepower</i>) 1 W-W A rare example of a 1 W-W miniature, much sought after. It has a longer frilled corona than Little Frills, and grows to only 8cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Minionette</p> <p>£15 5 available</p>	<p>AW AW 2674 (<i>marvieri x cyclamineus</i>) 6Y-Y A long-standing favourite of mine with chubby yellow flowers with a short corona and perianth which is well reflexed. Named after the cute yellow characters from the film 'Despicable Me' 12 cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Mitimoto</p> <p>£4 for 3 4 available</p>	<p>An innovative daffodil – the first bicoloured hoop petticoat. Another Aussie import. Golden corona, white perianth.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Mitzy</p> <p>£10 3 available <i>Daffodil Society Approved Miniature</i></p>	<p>6 W-W Very beautiful old Alec Gray hybrid which is sheer class. Opening W-Y, it fades to W-W. 'Snipe' is often exhibited in error as this species. Compare the photos! Mitzy's perianth reflexes more and the corona flares. Grows to 25cm.</p>

<p>Narcissus MOON group M</p> <p>£4 for 3 asstd sizes 20 available</p>	<p>AW AW 2773-2 (<i>cantabricus petunioides x romieuxii albidus SF110</i>) 10 W-W White wide-open hoops. This and the following Moon varieties make a beautiful early pot display. Vigorous and increase well.</p>








<p>Narcissus Panna Cotta group</p> <p>£8 7 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>rupicola Spring Charm x watieri</i>) 2 Y-Y Delightful clear pale lemon, scented, short-cupped hybrid with bluish foliage. Shorter growing than Crème Fraiche.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Papa Snoz</p> <p>£5 2 available</p>	<p>6 Y-Y Striking hybrid from Keira bulbs. Large flowers with swept back perianth and a flanged end to the corona. 16 cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus romieuxii</p> <p>£2 for 5 asstd sizes 5 packs available</p>	<p>A self-sown selected form of this species with flattish, widely flared lemon hoops on short stems., and a frilly edge.</p>	
<p>Narcissus romieuxii FS126/1</p> <p>£2 10 available</p>	<p>Interesting form of this species often with swept forward perianth.</p>






<p>Narcissus Scrum Half</p> <p>£15 3 available</p>	<p>BD (<i>asturiensis x Camborne</i>) 1 Y-Y Beautifully formed yellow trumpet, excellent for exhibition.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Second Fiddle</p> <p>£10 2 available</p>	<p>6 W-Y Pure white cyclamineus hybrid from Keira Bulbs in Australia. 15cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Sidora</p> <p>£8 8 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>cyclamineus x asturiensis</i>) 6 Y-Y One of my first hybrids, awarded a PC. Neat, small flowers on stems to 15cm.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Sleek</p> <p>* £30 1 available</p> <p>Max one per customer.</p>	<p>BD 6W-Y <i>N. cyclamineus</i> x Sdlg 2844 (<i>N. cyclamineus</i> op) Pure white perianth. <p>Narcissus Themisto</p> <p>£8 5 available</p>	<p>AW (<i>Atlas Gold x romieuxii albidus SF110</i>) 10 W-W Lovely member of the MOON group with large creamy white flowers with a rolled rim. 14 cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Treble Chance</p> <p>£3 for 5 asstd sizes 8 available</p>	<p>Selection from <i>N. romieuxii</i> with wide open creamy yellow hoops</p>	
<p>Narcissus triandrus var loiseleurii</p> <p>£15 1 available</p>	<p>I've been trying to obtain this very choice species for many years, and finally have the real thing sent as seed from Spain. Large elongated flowers of supreme elegance.</p>	
<p>Narcissus triandrus var triandrus</p> <p>£4 4 available</p>	<p>Charming species, grown from seeds, sent to me from Spain as <i>N. iohannis</i>. To 12 cm with hanging white flowers with a short corona.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Trumpet Voluntary</p> <p>* £15 7 available</p> <p>max 2 per customer</p>	<p>1 Y-Y Probably my most commented on variety! Growing to 20cm high with creamy flowers. The form is informal with a very full trumpet and very 'baroque' look, hence the name. Always causes comment at the shows.</p>

The leaves are broad, short and prostrate at flowering time which make a beautiful foil for the upright flowering stems which rise to about 15cm. Multiple flowers are usually produced per mature bulb. The flowers have a single inverted horseshoe mark over a deep, narrow sinus. The tips of the inners are flicked outwards. The outer segments are rounded and of good substance, and the spathe is straight.

Anemone apennina double blue £10 1 available	Found in an old garden in Ireland, so I'm not sure of the cultivar, if named. It changes colour slightly as it opens, from having a paler centre to all blue at maturity. Very slow to multiply.	
Anemone nemorosa Explosion £20 3 available Max one per customer.	An amazing variety found in Norway after the Chernobyl disaster. The double flowers are very variable from season to season and flower to flower on the same plant. Flowers usually contain a mixture of white, green and crimson.	
Anemone nemorosa Flash £8 4 available	A sport of 'Virescens' found in my garden. The usually plain green petaloids are splashed or wholly white, usually with deep blue bases. I would have said this was a cross between Virescens and Blue Eyes, but the former is completely sterile.

Anemone ranunculoides Orange £20 1 available	Single flowers which are a distinct light orange, very unusual. Slow to increase, very rare form.
