MESSAGE FROM THE AMERICAN FORESTS PRESIDENT & CEO

The *National Register of Big Trees* is more than a listing of arboreal giants. It's a testament to what we can do when we work collectively to preserve our nation's forests, and the big trees that reside in them.

To the Big Tree Hunters and State Coordinators,

The *National Register of Big Trees* is the culmination of hours spent searching for, measuring and compiling the preeminent list of our nation's most spectacular trees. We thank all of you who contributed your time and passion — from professional arborists and environmental activists to outdoor enthusiasts and tree lovers. We deeply appreciate your work in locating our country's champion trees.

Along with crowning these champions, we must also recognize that America's big trees face many challenges.

Our nation's forests, along with culturally, historically and ecologically significant trees, are in a battle against fire, disease, pests and a rapidly changing climate. Nowhere is that more evident than in some of the forests that are home to national champion trees.

Sugar pines, the tallest and most massive of the genus *Pinus*, were John Muir's favorite trees, which he called the "king of conifers." Last year, we lost the Whelan Pine, the national champion sugar pine. Though the cause of death is unknown, the tree had been suffering from western pine blister rust for some time and was located in an area affected by the Rim Fire. Big tree hunters along the West Coast — and across the country — mourned the loss of the Whelan Pine and its fellow big trees.

On June 30, 2013, 19 members of the Granite Mountain Hotshots wildfire crew died in the line of duty while fighting the Yarnell Hill Fire in Arizona. Among the trees that were spared by the crew's sacrifice was a national co-champion, the nearly 1,000-year-old alligator juniper. Our debt to the brave men who died cannot be repaid, but this special tree still stands as a monument to their remarkable commitment to the value they placed on protecting nature, forests and these remarkable trees.

Stories like these are evidence of the passion for trees behind the National Big Tree Program. Our national champions represent not only the biological spectacle of the natural world, but also the efforts of the people, groups, programs and states fighting every day to protect these great wonders for future generations. The *National Register of Big Trees* is more than a listing of arboreal giants. It's a testament to what we can do when we work collectively to preserve our nation's forests, and the big trees that reside in them.

MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL BIG TREE PROGRAM COORDINATOR

There are opportunities to explore the incorporation of big tree programs in U.S. territories, advance the accessibility of the register technologically through mobile apps and return to hosting measuring workshops and big tree tours

I fell out of a kayak into the Meherrin River trying to climb up the muddy bank looking for a potential national contender with Virginia big tree hunters. I had my first experience with coast redwoods at Muir Woods National Monument, just outside of the San Francisco Bay. I learned how to climb trees in Georgia and used a laser rangefinder for the first time in the old-growth forest at Cook Forest State Park. These are a few examples of big tree excursions I've had the opportunity to experience over the years and I look forward to venturing out to do more.

I have crowned and dethroned champions for the *National Register of Big Trees* seven times. The pressure of reviewing thousands of nominations with the expectation of presenting a list free of error doesn't get easier over time. As the gatekeeper of the national program, I am responsible for making critical decisions that not only impact what we do at American Forests, but all 51 state programs. I have had the opportunity to help countries develop their big tree programs, including welcoming South Korea's coordinator to our office for a visit. While being in charge of an extremely popular program can be daunting, the support I have received from state coordinators, certifiers, big tree hunters and tree enthusiasts has made this one of the most enjoyable professional and personal experiences.

As we approach the 75th anniversary of the program next year, much progress has been made, but there's still more to be done. There are opportunities to explore the incorporation of big tree programs in U.S. territories, advance the accessibility of the register technologically through mobile apps and return to hosting measuring workshops and big tree tours. Learning about what you are successfully doing in your communities to engage and educate the public is encouraging, particularly for what American Forests can also do to be successful in getting people to appreciate some of nature's most valuable resources.

Thank you to everyone who devotes energy into locating, registering and protecting our nation's trees and forests. You are responsible for the evolution of the National Big Tree Program to ensure it has the support needed to maintain its longevity. I am truly grateful that you are the true champions of the program.

Changes in the World of Big Trees

American Forests is dedicated to making a robust National Big Tree Program by expanding education and protection resources, getting families outdoors to look for national champions and teach tree lovers how to measure trees. Here is an update on the progress we've made and upcoming projects this year.



WEBINAR SERIES

American Forests and Laser Technology, Inc. (LTI), world leader in professional measurement lasers, will hold a three-part webinar series, Measurement Tools & Techniques, open to veteran and aspiring big tree hunters and tree-tech enthusiasts, to introduce the latest measuring guidelines from the National Big Tree Program. Each webinar will focus on one component of the equation used to crown a national champion tree: circumference, height and crown spread. Webinars will feature expert guest speakers affiliated with the National Big Tree Program.

Continuing Forestry Education credits will be granted for each webinar through the Society of American Foresters.

The LTI-sponsored, three-part webinar series will also provide attendees with an opportunity to win a TruPulse 360 laser. Participants who attend all three webinars will be automatically entered to win one of two lasers.

TREE PROTECTION TOOLKIT

The process to protect or save a tree is a worthwhile investment. Trees are often threatened by construction, street expansion, human activity or negligence. American Forests recognizes the need to provide resources to the public to help them understand the processes to protect threatened trees. We have heard from so many people who have benefitted from learning about tree ordinances, the role of arborists and how to calculate the value of urban trees, that it prompted us to expand the section with more resources. The toolkit is not

only a list of detailed action items but also an educational tool for individuals unfamiliar with the specific value a tree and its environmental, social and economic benefits.

The second installation of the Tree Protection Toolkit will launch with the fall 2014 *National Register of Big Trees*. The toolkit will focus on more long-term solutions with community involvement and elaborate on the economic benefits of conducting a tree appraisal. Tree appraisals are a helpful resource in situations such as filing insurance claims or conducting a cost-benefit analysis in saving existing trees or planting new trees.

The ultimate goal of the toolkit is to continuously add vital tools for individuals in urban and rural areas, while networking with existing programs that recognize trees of cultural significance.

THE BIG TREE WORKING GROUPS

Much progress has been made since we announced the creation of the Big Tree Working Groups in the spring 2012 register. American Forests assembled a group of experts to assist the national program by addressing some of the tough questions inherent to crowning champion trees. We needed a process to ensure the list of eligible species is representative of trees in the United States in a changing climate and that the measuring guidelines were more comprehensive than what is currently outlined on the website.

The Eligible Species Working Group (ESWG) was tasked with reviewing and updating the current list of eligible species, clarifying the definition of naturalized species and making a



decision on the inclusion of invasive and ornamental species on the *National Register*. The Measuring Guidelines Working Group (MGWG) had the challenge of refining the national standards for measuring trees by developing guidelines for all levels of participants of the program, increasing the accuracy of measurements on the register and creating criteria that will help certifiers across the country consistently measure trees with unusual form.

We are pleased to announce that their work has been completed and will be published this fall in the online Big Tree Handbook publication, a go-to guide that provides a comprehensive overview of the functions of National Big Tree Program at the national and state levels.

Eligible Species

American Forests has opened up the list of eligible species on the *National Register of Big Trees* to include non-native species. This means that nominations of new species from the public that meet the requirements under this new definition of eligibility will be accepted for the fall 2014 register.

The new rule states:

Eligible species must be recognized as either native, non-native, naturalized or a recognized naturally occurring variety in the United States. Hybrids, cultivars, ornamentals and unclassified varieties are excluded. American Forests has based this list on sources such as the USDA PLANTS Database and the Integrated Taxonomic Information System (ITIS).

Native, non-native and naturalized are defined as:

Native (indigenous) - A native tree is one that occurs naturally in an area that was not introduced intentionally or unintentionally by human activity.

Non-native (non-indigenous) - A non-native tree is one that occurs in an area that was introduced intentionally or unintentionally by human activity.

Naturalized: A naturalized tree is a non-native species that has become common in unmanaged areas and is able to reproduce and maintain itself without human assistance.

The classification of various species as invasive is not consistent across state boundaries, since each species does not always exhibit invasive characteristics in every location. State coordinators shall decide whether a nominated tree fits the definition of invasive in their state and therefore exclude that species from nomination to the *National Register*.

Measuring Guidelines

The MGWG has been successful in resolving many concerns for the national program and are continuing to tackle issues that have challenged the program for many years. So far the group has completed or made progress on:

- Creating a glossary of common forestry terms and tree definitions used by the program. The glossary will be an evolving list that incorporates new definitions needed for the national program.

- Adding to the nomination form to screen the process of potential national champions:
 - We are adding a field to indicate if a tree is single stem or multiple stem.
 - A new field will be added to indicate a nominator's status in relation to a state program. This will help American Forests identify volunteers and certifiers who are active with the national program.
- Ruling on which parts of a tree will be included for the measurement of a national champion tree. All parts of a tree, included dead parts of a tree's canopy will continue to be recognized for the register.
- Updating guidelines and measuring techniques with the equipment needed to maximize accuracy for the public, state and national levels for height, crown spread and circumference for single trunks.

NEXT STEPS


As the National Big Tree Program continues to grow, we are looking to:



A TREE CLIMBING ADVENTURE

National Big Tree Coordinator
Sheri Shannon heads for the trees
in her first tree-climbing adventure



As the coordinator for the National Big Tree Program, I have seen numerous images of arborists and researchers climbing superlative trees to get the most accurate measurement of height. From eastern hemlocks to ponderosa pines, photos of certified professionals in the tops of champion trees come across my computer screen and my jaw drops when I read the height on the nomination form. No, I don't see myself climbing the world's tallest coast redwood but I've always imagined what it would be like to be in the canopy of a tree I'd find in the town where I grew up, overlooking the forest, hanging midair with my feet dangling.

The first time I watched someone climb a tree with ropes was at the international tree climbing competition at the 2012 International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Conference. I watched an arborist from Denmark in the women's competition disappear into the branches, swing out to ring a bell on one branch, swing to another branch, tie a weird knot and then disappear into the canopy again. After watching the competition for a few hours, I had figured out the gist of how they were able to pull themselves up with various ropes and wanted to try it out myself. A year later, I got the opportunity at the 2013 Tree Climbers Rendezvous.

Patty Jenkins, executive director of Tree Climbers International, Inc. (TCI), invited me to speak about the Big Tree Program at this year's Rendezvous in Atlanta, Ga. Recreational and professional climbers, foresters, arborists and students were in attendance to not only climb trees but learn about old-growth forests, canopy research and advanced measuring techniques for big trees. I had a chance to sit down and chat with Peter Jenkins, founder of TCI and the man credited with developing recreational climbing in 1983. A retired rock climber and active arborist, Peter discussed the evolution of climbing, the debate over whether people should only climb for research purposes and the greater impact climbing can have for big tree programs everywhere. So, I was honored when Patty told me that her

husband would be the one taking me up for the first time.

The first thing I learned is to make sure the tree is clear before launching your throw line — a thin, brightly colored string connected to a small sand bag you throw upwards to loop around an upper branch. The next important thing I learned was to jump out of the way when the throw line comes flying back down if you don't hook the correct branch. I would say half of the battle is getting the throw line in place before you start tying your climbing line.

Several people pitched in during this

process and taught me about the equipment and techniques used to protect both tree and climber. Before being strapped in, I practiced tying the one knot I knew would save me if anything went awry — or at least I told myself that's the one thing that would save me. Sitting in the harness is like sitting on a swing. You're just hanging out, twirling around and kicking your legs around. It took me a few minutes to understand how to move myself up the rope using the foot loops but I slowly pieced the puzzle together. There is a technical explanation of how I was able

to climb the tree but all I kept thinking was, "bend your knees to loosen the knot, stand up and push the hitch." I repeated the same pattern and the voices below started to sound more distant and faint than when I was on the ground. That's when I looked down and my fear of heights gripped me. Whoa. I was so focused on the rope that I lost track of where I was in relation to the tree. I knew that I was safe and wasn't in any fear of falling but my mind was telling me to hurry up and get down. The voices below comforted me and told me to just relax and hang out for a bit. Let it all soak in. So I did.

I looked down and saw all the climbers below me. But, more importantly, I looked up and saw the sun shining through the tree's canopy. We have no idea what trees get to experience up there. I may have only been 20 feet off the ground and hadn't even reached the first major branch, yet I got to

experience the tree's true size more than I would have if I had been standing on the ground. You can see everything. What if this was the tallest tulip-poplar, eastern white pine or black maple for 50 miles? I would be standing in the crown, could look around and see how other trees around me measured up. What if I looked out and saw another tree that was taller than the one I was standing in? Eventually, I propelled down and my feet touched the ground. However, my heart was still in the trees. It took time as the coordinator of the national program to understand why big trees are an addiction for many people, but now I get it. It isn't just about bragging rights, but about the beauty and majesty of these champions. American Forests educates people about the many health benefits of trees and forests, and I left the rendezvous with a greater appreciation for the positive impacts climbing has on people of all ages.

Dr. John Gathright, founder of Tree Climbing Japan, the first school for climbing in the country, gave a presentation about his organization and the "Treehab" program that gives challenged persons the abilities to climb the world's largest trees. He helped Hikosaka Toshiko become the first severely physically challenged person to climb a 260-foot giant sequoia during the summer of 2001. The numerous stories of individuals who are blind, deaf or bound to a wheelchair and have found a way to climb trees and enjoy nature is inspiring. I am reminded of my mother telling me about the mighty oak that withstands adversity and is always there when we need it. This is the enduring legacy of trees and forests.
