

Chanticleer Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Chanticleer'

The foliage of the Chanticleer Pear is a bright green colour that changes to a bronze-orange in autumn. This upright ornamental pear with dense foliage, is suited to sites with restricted room for lateral crown growth.

Height: 8-10 metres Crown Spread: 5 metres Type: Medium sized ornamental street tree Origin: China Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

Flowers: Creamy white Bark: Light grey

Fruit pod: Small pea sized

Foliage: Glossy green

Autumn foliage: Bronze/copper







Chinese Flame Tree

Koelreuteria bipinnata

A medium sized deciduous tree, with an oval shape and unique lantern shaped fruit capsule. Chinese Flame Trees have a large, bipinnate compound leaf that turn to a golden colour in autumn. This differs from Koelreuteria paniculata which has a pinnate compound leaf.

Flowers: Yellow

Bark: Light grey

Fruit pod: Clusters of red/brown pods

Chinese Pistachio

Pistacia chinensis

A medium sized deciduous tree, with a wide spreading crown. The tree displays green foliage, which turns a spectacular red to orange through the Autumn months. A great street tree providing significant canopy cover for a tree of its height.

Height: 5- 10 metres Crown Spread: 6 - 8 metres Type: Medium sized street tree Origin: China Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

Flowers: Insignificant

- Bark: Dark grey and furrowed
- Fruit pod: Reddish brown
- Foliage: Green
- Autumn foliage: Vibrant red/orange







Claret Ash

Fraxinus oxycarpa 'Raywoodii'

This tall, broad tree was bred by a South Australian nurseryman in the early 1900s. The species is is well adapted to the Adelaide plains. Free of pests and diseases, under normal conditions it will develop into a well balanced, broad-domed tree. It is well-known for its claretcoloured autumn foliage.

Flowers: Nondescript
Bark: Grey/brown
Fruit pod: Winged seed pod

Coast Banksia

Banksia integrifolia

This evergreen tree displays a dense crown, with large yellow flowers. Native to Eastern Australia, the tree provides dense habitat for nectar feeding birds whilst providing a native appeal to the streetscape.

Height: 10 metres Crown Spread: 5-10 metres Type: Tall native tree Origin: Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flowers: Pale Yellow

Bark: Grey

Fruit pod: Greenish brown

Foliage: Dark green

Cottonwood

Hibiscus tiliaceus

This small Hibiscus is suitable for use in small gardens, courtyards, or as a stree tree in areas with restricted growing environments. The species displays a broad low crown, with heart shaped leaves and a stunning yellow flower.

Height: 4-5 metres Crown Spread: 3-4 metres Type: Ornamental street tree Origin: Asia, Eastern Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flowers: Large, yellow

Bark: Grey

Crepe Myrtle 'Tuscarora'

Lagerstroemia indica x fauriel 'Tuscarora'

A highly selected street and amenity tree, its compact size allows it to be planted where other trees are too large, with attractive bloom and bark.

Height: 1-8 metres Crown Spread: 1-8 metres Type: Compact street tree Origin: Hybridised in the USA Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

Flower: Hot pink
Bark: Mottled grey to cream, smooth
Fruit: Small brown capsule
Foliage: Light to glossy green

Autumn foliage: Deep red to bronze







Cup Gum Eucalyptus cosmophylla

This small to medium sized native tree has a shrub like habit that produces cream flowers. This tree is attractive to birds and insects. It has attractive greywhite bark.

Height: 5-10 metres Crown Spread: 5-10 metres Type: Small native tree Origin: South Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flower: Cream

Bark: Grey to white, smooth, fibrous

Fruit: Large cup shaped capsule

Foliage: Dark green to blue-green, thick cuticle







Dwarf Yellow Bloodwood

Corymbia eximia 'nana'

This medium sized native tree, adds a unique visual appeal to any streetscape. With its attractive bark, large leaves and flowers, the species can be used as feature specimen in any setting. 'nana' is a dwarf variety, making it more appropriate for areas with restricted growing environments. The flowers attract many bird and insect species.

European Nettle Tree

Celtis australis

A good shading and screening tree, planted extensivley throughout greater Adelaide primarily as a street tree.

Height: 5-15 metres Crown Spread: 5-15 metres Type: Medium sized street tree Origin: Southern Europe Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

Flower: Inconspicuous
Bark: Smooth grey to dark grey
Fruit: Single purple drupe
Foliage: Green, ovate, serrate margin
Autumn foliage: Yellow/orange to brown







Field Maple

Acer campestre 'Elsrijk'

This small Maple is suitable for use in small gardens, or as as street tree in areas with restricted growing environments. The species displays a dense oval to conical crown, and brings a beautiful visual appeal to the streetscape.

Height: 6-7 metres Crown Spread: 5-6 metres Type: Ornamental street tree Origin: Holland Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

Flowers: Insignificant

Bark: Grey/brown

Fruit pod: Winged, brown green

Foliage: Green

Autumn foliage: Yellow







Golden Rain Tree

Koelreuteria paniculata

A medium sized deciduous tree, with an oval shape and unique lantern shaped fruit capsule. Golden Rain Trees have a large, pinnate compound leaf that turn to a golden colour in autumn. This differs from Koelreuteria bipinnata which has a bipinnate compound leaf.

Flowers: Deep yellow

Bark: Grey brown

Fruit pod: Clusters of red/brown pods

Foliage: Light green

Green Honey Locust

Gleditisia triancanthos 'Shademaster'

This is a large, fast growing, deciduous tree with a broad crown and pendulous habit. The dark to mid-green leaves turn a rich yellow in Autumn. A reliable selection for streetscapes and reserves.

Height: 5-12 metres Crown Spread: 5-12 metres Type: Ornamental street tree Origin: North America Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

Flower: Cream clusters

- Bark: Corky/fissured, brown to grey
- Fruit: Large brown follicle
- Foliage: Green, pinnate
- Autumn foliage: Yellow







Grey Box Eucalyptus microcarpa

This large, native evergreen tree displays a rounded crown, providing commanding shade when fully mature. Flowers are large, white in colour and appear in late Summer through early Autumn. The tree performs well in a variety of soil types and provides important habitat value for local fauna.

Height: Up to 20 metres Crown Spread: 7-8 metres Type: Hardy indigenous tall tree Origin: Indigenous to the Burnside area Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flowers: Yellowish white
Bark: Grey and fibrous
Fruit pod: Greenish brown

Ivory Curl Flower

Buckinghamia celsissima

A small amenity tree with low maintenance requirements and tremendous floral display. A species originating in the Queensland rainforests, it presents a spreading, rounded crown when planted in an open position.

Height: 1-8m Crown Spread: 1-8m Type: Small amenity tree Origin: QLD Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flower: White to cream

Bark: Smooth, grey to brown

Fruit: Woody follicle

Foliage: Elliptical, entire, glossy green







Jacaranda

Jacaranda mimosifolia

Jacaranda is a fast-growing tree with a well rounded canopy that when mature, adds an attractive aspect to a street. This tree symbolises the City of Burnside and forms an integral part of the City's logo. This tree will do well under fairly hot, dry conditions. Jacarandas are easily maintained and pruned to achieve a well-balanced shape, ideal for streets.

Flowers: Mauve bells in early summer
Bark: Light grey

Japanese Maple

Zelkova serrata

An adaptable tree with good uniformity and branch structure. Excellent street and avenue tree where its natural habit allows vehicular and pedestrian traffic to pass.

Height: 5-10 metres Crown Spread: 5-10 metres Type: Small to medium sized street tree Origin: China and Japan Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

Flower: Inconspicuous
Bark: Grey to pink to brown, forming plates
Fruit: Small drupe
Foliage: simple, green, serrate,
Autumn foliage: Bronze to orange







Kurrajong

Brachychiton populneus

The Kurrajong is adaptable to varied soils, is deep-rooted, and is distributed throughout eastern Australia. It has bellshaped, pale pink flowers which it bears between March and December. The species is one of very few semi - deciduous species native to Australia, and can drop its leaves in early Summer.

Lemon-scented Gum

Corymbia citriodora

A large amenity tree with low maintenance requirements and beautiful crown architecture at maturity.

Height: 10-25 metres Crown Spread: 15-25 metres Type: Large street or reserve tree Origin: Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergeen

Flower: White corymbs
Bark: Smooth, cream, grey, white, pink
Fruit: Urn shaped capsule
Foliage: Light green to glossy green







Magnolia 'Little Gem'

Magnolia grandiflora 'little gem'

This small evergreen tree displays a round to broadly oval crown, with contoured foliage colour lending a graceful air to the tree. Flowers are large, creamy white in colour and appear in early summer. The species is considered a feature tree and adds beauty to the streetscape.

Height: 5 metres Crown Spread: 3 metres Type: Small specimen tree Origin: North America Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flowers: Creamy white

Bark: Light grey

Fruit pod: Greenish brown

Foliage: Glossy green/brown

Autumn foliage: Glossy green/brown







Manchurian Pear

Pyrus ussuriensis

The foliage of the Manchurian Pear is a lustrous, dark green colour that changes to a bronze-orange in autumn. Its thick, stout trunk supports a dense crown. It responds well to additional water in the later months of summer. White flowers are borne in early spring, with a round, pea-sized berry in late summer.

Height: 10 metres Crown Spread: 8 metres Type: Hardy medium sized tree Origin: Northeast Asia Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

- Flowers: White Bark: Light brown/grey Fruit pod: Small pea sized
- Foliage: Glossy green
- Autumn foliage: Bronze/copper







Manna Ash

Fraxinus ornus 'Meczek'

A small and successful street tree within southern Australia, highly adaptable and well suited to the climate of greater Adelaide.

Height: 2-8 metres Crown Spread: 2-8 metres Type: Native ornamental tree Origin: Southern Europe Evergreen/Deciduous: Decidious

Flower: Creamy white

Bark: Light creamy grey, smooth to lighly fissured

Fruit pod: light brown samara

Foliage: Glossy green/brown

Autumn foliage: Yellow/brown







Queensland Box

Lophostemon confertus

A highly successful medium sized street tree with no unique maintenance requirements.

Height: 5-15 Crown Spread: 5-15 metres Type: Medium sized street tree Origin: QLD Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flower: White to cream

Bark: Grey to brown fibrous at base, smooth

grey to cream upper crown

Fruit: Small brown capsule

Foliage: Glossy green, entire margin







River Red Gum

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

An iconic speices that can develop into a large, striking amenity tree. Ideally suited to reserves and large verges due to the crown dimensions the tree can reach at maturity.

Height: 10-35m Crown Spread: 10-35m Type: Large amenity tree Origin: NSW, VIC, SA, southern QLD, northern WA Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flower: Borne on umbels in 7-11, white flower
Bark: Pale grey-cream to faint yellow/pink, brown
Fruit: Capsule, ~5mmx10mm, exerted valves
Foliage: Dull green-grey, lanceolate, pendulous







SA Blue Gum

Eucalyptus leucoxylon

A medium to large amenity tree with low maintenance requirements, suitable for reserve and streetscape planting.

Height: 10-25 metres Crown Spread: 10-25 metres Type: Medium to large amenity tree Origin: South Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flower: Cream, pink, red

Bark: Decorticating, persistent sock rough

brown bark, upper bark is white to grey



Fruit: Barrel shaped capsule

Foliage: Dull green to grey green





Smooth Barked Apple Myrtle

Angophora costata

An attractive ornamental native tree, which grows into a rounded, arched shaped tree. Tolerates a variety of soil types and is very hardy once established. The tree is a major food source for many species including numerous invertebrates, flying foxes and seed eating parrots.

Height: 15-18 metres Crown Spread: 12 metres Type: Hardy tall street tree Origin: Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flowers: Yellowish white

Bark: Pink to pale grey

Fruit pod: Brown

Foliage: Dark green

Autumn foliage: Dark green











Southern Cypress Pine

Callitris gracillis

A small hardy tree indigenous to the Burnside area, with low maintenance requirements, suitable for both reserve and streetscape planting.

Height: 2-12 metres Crown Spread: 2-10 metres Type: Small pyramidal evergreen tree Origin: South Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Bark: Grey-brown, compact rough-smooth
Fruit: Round cones, six scales
Foliage: Medium green, cypress like scales







Tuckeroo

Cupaniopsis anacardiodes

This upright, densely crowned tree grows to 7-8 metres in height, with a spread of 6 metres. An evergreen, its flower is yellow and produces a small bright-orange seed pod. Tuckeroo's are tolerant of summer conditions but prefers additional summer water to create humidity around the tree, when it produces lush, glossy new growth.

Flowers: Yellow

Bark: Smooth brown/grey

Water Gum

Tristaniopsis laurina

This small evergreen tree displays a round oval crown, with clusters of yellowish-white flowers. Native to Eastern Australia, the tree provides dense habitat for birds whilst providing a native appeal to the streetscape.

Height: 5-7 metres Crown Spread: 4-6 metres Type: Small native tree Origin: Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

- Flowers: Yellowish white
- Bark: Light grey
- Fruit pod: Greenish brown
- Foliage: Glossy green
- Autumn foliage: Glossy green







Water Gum 'Luscious'

Tristaniopsis laurina 'luscious'

Tristaniopsis laurina 'luscious' is a horticultural cultivar, with a larger, glossier leaf than Trisaniopsis laurina. It is often used as an ornamental native tree in streets and provides dense habitat for birds.

White Cedar 'Lilac Lady'

Melia azedarach 'lilac lady'

A vigorous tree that is an oddity in that it is one of the very few Australian native plants that is winter deciduous. The tree has an umbrella shaped habit, similar to common White Cedars planted throughout the City, except the species is engineered to produce minimal flowers and fruit.

Height: 10-12 metres Crown Spread: 8-10 metres Type: Medium sized native tree Origin: Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

- Flowers: Lilac tuber shaped
- Bark: Dark greyish-brown
- Fruit pod: Low fruiting variety
- Foliage: Lush glossy green
- Autumn foliage: Rich yellow







Wilga

Geijera parviflora

This small evergreen tree displays a rounded to oval crown, whilst fine textured foliage lends a graceful air to the tree. Flowers are small, white to cream in colour and appear in late spring through summer. The tree performs well in a variety of soil types and is highly wind and drought tolerant.

Height: 6-8 metres Crown Spread: 6 metres Type: Wide spreading native tree Origin: Australia Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

- Flowers: White and cream
- Bark: Dark grey to brown
- Fruit pod: Non seeding species
- Foliage: Dull to glossy green
- Autumn foliage: Dull to glossy green







Willow Myrtle

Agonis flexuosa

A small weeping amenity tree with low maintenance requirements and tremendous floral bloom.

Height: 5-12m Crown Spread: 5-12m Type: Small amenity tree Origin: WA Evergreen/Deciduous: Evergreen

Flower: White axillary clusters

Bark: Rough, grey to brown

Fruit: Small woody capsule

Foliage: Simple, lanceolate, pendulous, mid-dark green
