Jane uses 3 structures to house her diverse collection of orchids. She and Roger have recently re-lined 2 structures with the Sancell horticultural bubble-wrap, and members might be interested to see how that was done. Of particular interest to novices, will be Laurie Woods' demonstration of how to construct a simple plastic-covered structure to house cool-growing orchids such as cymbidiums and natives. It's a good opportunity to see how Jane grows her orchids and to socialise with other members. There's no fixed program – come and go anytime between 1 and 4 pm.

Speaker: Kevin Dawes on Dendrochilums

Kevin noted that Dendrochilums were not particularly popular despite the fact that they are great plants, and they are closely related to Coelogynes which are popular. Dendrochilums grow in the mossy wet cloud forests of Borneo and the Philippines. There are about 270 species that grow on rocks and trees and they all need a lot of humidity and water.

Kevin then described all the *Dendrochilum* species that he grows:

- D. abortum: small grass-like leaves with small flowers
- *D. arachnites*: spider-like flowers up to 2 cm
- *D. banksii*: also a grass-like species with orange flowers a new species named for David Banks and therefore expensive
- *D. cobbianum*: larger flowers, white with yellow lip to the labellum
- *D. convallariaeforme*: twisting flower spikes quite long above the foliage
- D. javierii: produces lots of flowers
- D. latifolium: large plant with long racemes of small flowers
- D. cootesii: hard to grow as it's from the mountains of Luzon, but it's a very desirable plant with cream coloured flowers
- *D. cornutum*: very small plant with small flowers
- D. curraii: also very small
- D. formosum: also very small
- *D. glumaceum*: a larger plant but of manageable size with fragrant flowers
- *D. magnum*: a big plant with very showy flowers and the largest of the Dendrochilums. It likes lots of water
- D. microchillum: another of the very small plants
- D. saccolabium: can have red flowers but often the flowers are more brown than red and therefore it is best to buy one in flower if you want the red. Don Chesher has one on the bench which is a great red
- *D. stenophyllum*: also small
- *D. ucatum*: unusual in that it has green flowers rather than cream
- D. tenellum: classically called the "grass orchid" with dainty flowers very cute and easy to grow
- D. vanoverbergii: very small
- D. wenzelii: range of different colours and easy to grow
- D. williamsii: a really nice plant
- *D. yuccafolium*: has pleated leaves like a yucca, but the flower racemes are shorter than the leaves

In general, with all Dendrochilums one does not divide the plant but lets it grow to specimen size. Often they are quite slow growing so it may take some years to reach a large size.

Best Dendrochilums: magnum, latifolium, tenellum, glumaceum, cobbianum, wenzelii & cootsii.

They love to grow in coconut husk as they like the moisture that it retains.

D. latifolium like *D. magnum* can be large plants and have flowers that last. *D. cobbianum* has beautiful flowers.

They all like to be kept wet and grow in a range of light levels - some species with grass-like leaves require more light than those with broader, softer leaves.

Kevin doesn't fertilize his plants except once in a while.
