



We recognize President Barack Obama for designating the Monument that contains these beautiful plants.

THIS LIST OF 129 SPECIES is created from the plants noted in the Proclamation that established Bears Ears National Monument. The Proclamation listed names that were sometimes general, such as aster or bluegrass, and other times more specific such as Kachina daisy or four-wing saltbrush. When a general plant name was listed we included multiple species that are associated with that name, and which are known to occur within the Monument boundary.

The plants are grouped first by growth form:

- Forbs/herbaceous (65 species; includes wildflowers and subshrubs)
Page 5
- Grasslike (15 species; includes grasses and horsetails)
Page 16
- Cacti (5 species)
Page 19
- Shrubs (30 species)
Page 20
- Trees (14 species)
Page 25

Secondly, within each growth form the plants are listed alphabetically by the common name that was in the Proclamation, and by common generic name if there is more than one plant that shares that name (as in beard-tongue, beeflower, columbine, daisy, sagebrush and willow). Plants noted as “endemic” are found only in the Colorado Plateau according to the USDA Plants database (plants.usda.gov). Plants listed as “imperiled” are endemic to that same region, but are also globally imperiled because they are so uncommon according to NatureServe (www.natureserve.org).



We recognize that there are many more plants in Bears Ears National Monument than those listed here. This document merely presents the plants that were highlighted in the Proclamation. We hope that in the near future a complete list of the plants of Bears Ears National Monument will be developed.
