Dear Orchid Friends and Customers,

It's the beginning of December and I am busy in the nursery with the repotting and dividing of some very large plants! The weather has been variable and at present we have a drought with only 45mm rain since September. We therefore have onerous water restrictions and I am watching my tanks carefully to conserve what I have. The load shedding isn't helping, of course, as the water purification plants need power in order to operate – I will join many others in a prayer for rain plus a rain-dance if necessary!

We had our Society show towards the end of September and the committee did a good job with advertising. A garden club customer of mine called the local paper after I did a talk and potting demo for them, and the result was a great article with photos the week prior to the show – what more can one ask for! The show was very well attended, in two and a half days we had over 1,000 visitors. We still do a landscaping arrangement with a theme which we always find very successful, but hard work! Plant sales were exception with a new record set for total of sales.

Other news is that I will be changing the The Courier Guy for my Door to Door deliveries. My previous couriers have just let me down for the umtenth time. Apologies to any customers who were affected by their negligence and the fact that it was impossible to tract parcels online. I assure you all that my frustration equals yours!

I have managed to obtain a number of new plants this year but am still unable to import due to the enormously increased cost of airfreight to bring the plants into South Africa. The Ecuagenera plants are mainly Phragmipediums and a few Epidendrum so be sure to look at the updated list. I am hopeful of an order from Taiwan but it is not yet confirmed.

Do read the descriptions on the new list – I have put the quantities left over if there are only a few in stock, sometimes only one, but if it is a nice plant, it's a pity not to offer it. I have also divided some of my own stock and they will be added as soon as they are rooted and ready to go.

I am still only open to the public on a Wednesday morning from 10am – 1pm, otherwise by appointment. Address is 34 Napier Str, Blanco, George.



3. **Note!** I use Courier Guy Couriers for Door to Door, minimum cost is R250 or 15%. As we have a local Postnet, I am prepared to use them provided the parcels are small and under 3kg. R100 should cover it if less than 3kg and small in volume. They can be collected at your nearest Postnet depot. Large cymbidiums or other large plants may attract a higher courier fee than 15%.
4. All plants are all sent in their containers with the potting mix sealed into the pot. Large plants can be sent bareroot if requested in order to save money.
5. The nursery is open Wednesdays from 10am – 1pm. All other times by appointment. We are still open if Wednesday falls on a Public Holiday.
