

Cytisus

Cytisus, Broom Hybrids (*Fabaceae*)



"Porlock"

Vigorous semi-deciduous shrub, with tripalmate leaves, 1-2 cm long. Very perfumed yellow flowers blossom nearly always in spring, rarely in winter (unless in mild climate). Also thrives in a pot.

praecox

Deciduous shrub with thin, flexible branches and dense growth. Simple leaves, green, 1-2cm long. Large, sulphur-yellow flowers, similar to pea flowers, strongly scented, from April-May. Requires slightly sandy soil, not calcareous.

**Scoparius
(Sarothamnus scoparius)**

Native to Western Europe and all over Italy. Deciduous shrub, upright, with numerous thin branches with bright green bark. Lower leaves are green, divided into 3 leaflets, each one 0.50 cm; the upper leaves are simple, almost sessile. Flowers: like pea flowers and a rich yellow, in May-June, followed by fruits which are like flat, black pods. Adapts to most types of soil but soil that is too moist or too calcareous should be avoided.
